KG 137.7 **Reports of Sub-Committees**

- 7.1 **ESF Diploma Sub-Committee (SC/0809/1/5)**  
Council received the report noted above. SC briefed the meeting which mainly focused on the Advanced Diploma. Members recognised that the work done by the Advanced Diploma students was impressive and practical. It is suggested that the review is shared with the School Council once the results are out.

Teaching Staff issues

### 7.3 Premises Sub-committee (SC/0809/1/7)

Council received the report noted above. RN briefed the meeting.

- Summer works 08 was satisfactory.
- KGV Redevelopment  
Lead Consultants Bids – Four presentations were done today by four architects. Given the fact that ESF Facilities Department is basically responsible for all premises facilities work in all ESF schools and the funding and finance comes under the Finance Department, John Stewart and Rob Bennett were also involved in the whole process. Decisions will come out beginning of next week. The architect appointed will take and manage the project right through to completion. Construction work is aimed to start in the summer 2010 and completed building to be handed over in summer 2012.

### 7.4 Finance Sub-committee (SC/0809/1/8)

Council received the report noted above. ST briefed the meeting.

- There is a total saving of about HK\$2.4M. The issue of how to spend this money on capital projects will be approved by the Finance Sub-committee. A menu of items will be finalised by the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and be taken to the Finance Sub-committee for approval.
- 1-1 Learning Programme – the funding issue is to be brought back to the next School Council meeting.
- The attempt to vary the terms of the Peace Memorial Scholarship is still under way. The Chairman explained the situation as below:
  - ⇒ Established in 1920s with an endowment made.
  - ⇒ Now held and managed by HKSBC Trustees on behalf of KGV.
  - ⇒ Beneficiaries - boys of English nationality who wished to take up the farming or sciences, or more technical subject of sciences.

- ⇒ This was taken to court in 1950s with a view to amending the beneficiaries, and there was some relaxation and redefined.
- ⇒ Currently a central fund about £15,000 to be distributed.
- ⇒ Hasn't been awarded to any students at least 10 years.
- ⇒ Equal Opportunities Commission viewed that if boys are the only beneficiaries it may contravene the Ordinance, but there are certain exemptions within the Ordinance, one of which involves charities.
- ⇒ The trustees advised us to take legal advice on this issue.

Hopefully this can be clarified and awarded to a student by next year's Speech Day.

Council suggested that the School keeps Rob Bennett at ESF informed of this scholarship.

- 9.1 Parent Reps raised the issue of school visits. GW replied that some legitimate visits for Y6 parents have been organised recently. Something much more formal, e.g. Open Day is being looked at.
- 9.2 MG expressed that he enjoyed having been on the School Council for 26 years. His first association with KGV was a cricket match in October 1953. MG thanked EW for the letter and would be very pleased to help the School whenever the School has the need. Dinner with Michael Guilford will be on 17 or 18 December 2008. PN to email Council.
