## The English Schools Foundation

The English Schools Foundation (ESF) is the largest English-medium international school organisation in Hong Kong. Our 22 schools and comprehensive programme of extra-curricular activities bring out the best in every student through a personalised approach to learning and by inspiring curious minds. There are over 18,000 students from 75 different nationalities in ESF kindergartens, primary, secondary and all-through schools.

ESF is proud of the high academic and wider achievements of our students. In May 2023, 11 ESF students achieved the perfect score of 45 points in the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

### **King George V School**

King George V School predates the establishment of the ESF and is one of the oldest schools in Hong Kong. It is an international non-selective secondary school of over 1,900 students between the ages of 11 and 18. Founded in 1894, KGV School joined the ESF in 1979 and remains to-date as the largest secondary school in the Foundation, offering affordable education through the medium of English. It is open to children of all backgrounds who are residents in Hong Kong. There are no entry requirements. The school employs over 140 teaching staff, trained mainly in the U.K., Australia, Canada, U.S.A. and Hong Kong.

Our Purpose is to be 'Be your own remarkable...' and our Vision is to create a 'school for one'. A place where each student feels that the school was created just for them. We personalise learning so everyone is supported and encouraged to achieve at a high level, and to develop holistically to be the best person they can be. Our school thrives on a culture where a diversity of ideas, beliefs, and values are equally cherished, respected, and heard. We seek to continuously collaborate, innovate, and improve to make a difference in the communities we serve and lead.

Our KGV Lion Values are Honesty - be truthful, fair and authentic; Courage - be vulnerable, brave and resilient; Empathy - be kind, understand, and respectful.

#### **Co-curriculum**

Students are offered many different opportunities to enhance their learning and take their experiences outside the classroom. All KGV students commit to an activity during Challenge Week when students take part in a week of activities on creativity, action & service. Our strong House System provides for positive competition and a closer rapport between students and teachers. It is an integral and vibrant part of our culture. King George V School does not provide GPA or rank students.

#### Year 7-9 Curriculum

Year 7-9 students study the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) for three years. The MYP builds upon the knowledge, skills and attitudes developed in the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) and prepares students to meet future academic challenges, including IGCSE, BTEC and the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP). Teaching and learning in the MYP is framed by inquiry, action and reflection. Students are taught by subject specialists across eight learning areas to enable them to engage in purposeful inquiry in a robust academic setting.

#### Year 10 and 11 Curriculum

Year 10 and 11 students follow a two-year cycle of study in which they prepare for the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) or International GCSE (IGCSE) examinations. The results of these examinations are graded from A\* to G / 9 to 1. With a core of Mathematics, English Language and Literature, Double Science Award, and a Foreign Language (French, Spanish, German, Chinese), students then opt for subjects from Humanities, Performing Arts, Design & Technology and P.E.

#### Year 12 and 13 Curriculum

Students work toward either the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma or the British Business and Technology Education Council (BTEC) Diploma (Level 3). Students have a number of courses to choose from and will select according to their future career/education aspirations. They sit examinations at the end of Year 13 and are not awarded mid-year grades. At the end of Year 13, approximately 90% of students go on to study in many parts of the world. The balance typically takes a gap year, employment or military service.


#### International Baccalaureate




Students taking the IB Diploma choose six subjects to study, normally three at Higher Level and three at Standard Level. The maximum score awarded for the IB Diploma is 45 points. Each subject is awarded a maximum of 7 points, and there are a maximum of 3 further points available for Theory of Knowledge (ToK) and Extended Essay (EE). Students also have to complete a CAS (Creativity, Action and Service) programme. A number of students also choose to take the Bilingual IB Diploma.

#### International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP)

Career-related Programme Students study a minimum of two IB Diploma Programme Courses, a core consisting of 4 components and a career-related study. The career-related study is chosen from one or two of our BTEC programmes on offer. The four elements of the IBCP core include a programme of language include a programme of language and professional skills as well as completing a reflective project, which is focused on an

#### **BTEC Pathway**




Students taking the BTEC pathway follow a career-oriented applied learning pathway and work towards a full Extended Diploma or Diploma and a Subsidiary Diploma at Level 3. They can complement their studies by studying up to two IB course subjects at Standard Level or Higher Lever, and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS). The grading for BTEC qualifications is Distinction

(D), Merit (M), Pass (P), with D\* awarded for exceptional performance. Students have access to a wide range of university options worldwide. We offer BTEC courses at Level 3 in Art & Design, Business, Media, and Sports. We also offer a range of Level 2 courses in ICT and Cooking
